WCO team is translating WHO transformation strategic objectives at country level.

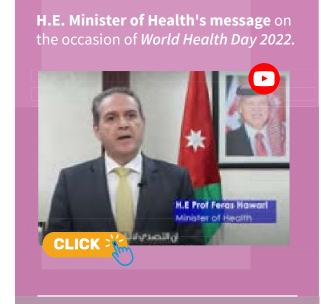
